Modern technology is not a threat to library and information services or a death knell to the physical book. The highly technological countries still have and encourage reading of books. Printing presses are still being established. The alarm about the death of the book and paperless offices was raised in the first and second world countries. This Alarm remains an alarm among the futurists in those countries. A new invention does not necessarily render existing facilities obsolete. At the worst, the physical book will continue to remain side by side with the e-book.

Policy-makers who belong to the school of thought whose tenet is that the library and the book are mere relics of an inefficient past must be proved wrong by our present and future services to our users.

The struggle for the completion of the 40- year old National Library of Nigeria must be vigorously pursued. Our Government and her functionaries should be made to realize that the National Library of the United States – The Library of Congress metarmorphosed from the equivalent of our National Assembly. While we wish our departed founding fathers a free passage to the Luminous Gardens of their Creator, we pray for more strength for ourselves to continue with the struggle for the survival of our Profession. Once again, I wish ourselves a successful Conference and Annual General Meeting. Amen

#### **ARLS** Journal

Academic and Research Libraries Section floats a peer-reviewed journal titled": Nigerian Academic and Research Libraries Journal (NARLJ). The maiden volume was published in June 2022. The Journal's frequency is twice per year (June & December). The volume 2 Numbers 1 and 2 are still available for sale. Meanwhile volume 3 number 1 (June, 2024) is the most current Issue of the Journal which should be purchased by librarians in academic and research libraries and indeed other libraries. The Editor-in-Chief is Prof Akobundu Uga at Joseph Sarwuan Tarka University, Makurdi, Benue State.

#### **Annual General Meetings**

The ARLS annual general meetings have always held at the various NLA national conferences venues. This year, at Port Harcourt, during Sections meetings the Executive shall be meeting with every ARLS member in attendance in order to brief them on current status (in terms of programmes, finances etc) of the Section. The ARLS Executive is poised to maintain the transparent leadership bequeathed to her by past Exco members.

#### National Conferences

The ARLS organized her 9<sup>th</sup> National Conference on 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> November 2023. The conference was virtual (zoom). The theme was "*Current Trends and Emerging Issues in Academic and Research Libraries for Information Service Delivery*". This theme aligned with the American Library Association's ARL Section. The conference papers x-rayed the types of information services deliver and trends in academic and research libraries.

The conference's keynote speaker was Prof Jubril Attahiru Alhassan of Federal University of Kashere; whereas he lead paper presenter was Prof Yetunde A. Zaid of University of Lagos. The conference papers were co-edited by Dr. Isaac M. Ogbonna, Dr. Ifeanyi J. Ezema, Dr. Jonathan N. Chimah and Dr. Brendan E. Asogwa. Afterwards, the conference proceedings was published electronically and mailed to contributors. Again, aligning with international theme, the ARLS has come up with a theme for the 2024 National Conference as *"Academic and Research Libraries in Transition: The Challenges of Emerging Technologies"*. This conference is scheduled to hold between 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> September 2024 at the PG School of Benson Idahosa University, Benin City. The keynote speaker is Prof. Luke Osamudiamen Obasayi whereas the lead paper present is Dr. Tony Kpomuosa Obaseki. Every academic and research librarian is expected to participate in the upcoming ARLS conference.



## NIGERIAN LIBRARY ASSOCIATION PUBLIC LIBRARY SECTION REPORT

#### A. WORKSHOPS/CONFERENCES

#### 1. Public Librarianship Consultative Summit: Issues, Challenges & Opportunities

On Wednesday May 17 2023 the Public Library Section held a virtual national summit in collaboration with the American Centre in Lagos. The theme: Public Librarianship Consultative Summit: Issues, Challenges & opportunities x-rayed major problems and issues affecting public libraries in Nigeria. The Summit was well attended by major stakeholders in librarianship in Nigeria which included Chairmen of Library Boards, academic librarians, Public librarians and Librarians from all sectors. The summit stressed that public libraries are closer to the people in the community and accessible to all. It sees public libraries as the veritable community melting pot for cultural and grassroots participation in the gathering and exchange of information. The summit resolves that Public Libraries are hamstring by low staff motivation, inadequate staffing and training, low capacity building as well as widespread obsolescence of resources and infrastructural decay. Most importantly however the summit surmised that most public librarians were doing little or nothing to aid the growth of public libraries in Nigeria. The summit therefore called on heads of public libraries to canvass innovative ideas and programmes that would sell/ promote their libraries and make public libraries not only attractive to the government and user community but also help them to attract grants, funds and revenue.

2. The 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of the National Librarian with the State Librarians, Directors and Chairmen of public Library Boards in Nigeria, with the theme: *Public Libraries: Gateway to Sustainable Development* was held at the Sulgad Majestic Hotels, Maidugari bypass, Bauchi on the 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> of May 2024. The Conference was coordinated under the auspices of the National Library of Nigeria in collaboration with the Bauchi State Library Board. The Conference aims to put all the issues that affect public libraries on the front burners and to affirm their commitment to quality library services in line with the sustainable development goals that are beneficial to all.

- i. It was observed that most of the library boards lack rural spread.
- ii. abysmal obsolescence of resources and dilapidated buildings, equipment and facilities was reported in the few existing public libraries in the capital cities of Nigeria.
- iii. Most of the public libraries in Nigeria lack qualified library personnel to drive sustainable development goals; Aging and retiring experienced personnel are not being replaced with the result that many state libraries such as Kaduna and Edo, no longer have qualified librarians.
- iv. Most Heads of State Library Boards are not sufficiently exploiting opportunities and alternative sources of funds through collaborations, partnership and grants.

The two day Conference was well attended by distinguished personalities in education and librarianship within and outside the Bauchi State. Among them dignitaries are the representative of the Executive Governor of Bauchi State His Excellency Senator Bala Abdulkadir Mohammed, the Speaker of Bauchi State House of Assembly Rt. Honorable Representative of the Honourable Minister of State for Education, The State Commissioner for Education Dr. Jamila Mohammed Dahiru, Permanent Secretaries, State Chairman of the NLA, Ag. Registrar of LRCN, Vice-Chancellors, Polytechnic and College Librarians to mention but a few.

The Honourable Commissioner for Education Dr. Jamila Mohammed Dahiru was the keynote speaker while the lead paper, *fostering social cohesion and civic engagement through public libraries* was presented by Professor M. Malumfashi of the Department of Library & Information Science ATBU.

#### **B. REPORTS FROM ACROSS THE STATES IN BRIEF**

Most of the libraries are not strategically positioned for services to attain the SDG; From the reports from across the states, Niger, Cross River, Imo, Abia, Ekiti, Plateau, Kogi, zamfara, Yobe, Borno, Taraba, Ebonyi, Benue and Edo state public libraries are especially worse examples in terms of inadequate and dilapidated infrastructure, building, equipment and obsolescence of collections. Oyo and Enugu State Library Boards have adequate but aging infrastructure and a good spread of branches which needs rehabilitation. A few state libraries such as Lagos, Anambra, Gombe, Kwara, Ogun and Kano State Library Boards have good modern infrastructure. Of the lot, Kano and Anambra State library Boards are blazing the trail and doing exceptionally well. They have consistently maintained series of literacy programmes and activities over the last five years and have a young readers club with a significant number of zonal and community libraries. Kano State Library Board has one of the biggest State Library building and maintains a CBT hub with 250 to 350 computers apart from their e-learning centres and electronic Libraries.

#### ACTIVITIES FROM JANUARY 2023 TO JUNE 2024

#### Meetings

There was a handover activity to the new Executive Council of Nigerian Library Association (NLA), Anambra State Chapter on January10, 2023. The new Chairperson Dr. Ngozi Perpetua Osuchukwu and her Team assumed active duties immediately.

The State Chapter planned and implemented 4 Exco meetings comprised 1 in-person and 3 online sessions. The Ordinary General Meetings (OGM) for 2023 were four with 2 in-persons (9th February, 2023 and the AGM on 1<sup>st</sup> Dec) and 2 online meetings.

They defied Covid-19 and ASUU strikes that delayed their programs to stand strong. We published Conference Compendium and Brochure. Papers were presented and AGM took place on the 1st December, 2023 at the Auditorium of Prof. Kenneth Dike State Central Library, Awka.

#### Remittances

NLA Anambra paid its remittances of annual dues and the conference return of 40% to the National for 2023 financial matters.

#### NLA Anambra mourns

In 2023, Anambra State Chapter lost a member, MrsObiomaObiekwe, a staff of Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka, Nigeria. She was also a PhD student. Our member Mrs Victoria Ezejiofor of Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka, Nigeria also lost her husband. 




### 2024 WORLD BOOK AND COPYRIGHT DAY



The coming on board of new executives coincided with the inauguration of the long awaited Ogun State Library Board headed by Prof. Segun Awonusi with three of our librarians making the list Viz: Mr. Vincent Giwa (Director of Simeon Adebo Library), Dr. Oyinade Tomori (Immediate past Chairman NLA, Ogun State Chapter) and Dr. Adebambo Oduwole (Immediate past University Librarian, Olabisi Onabanjo University, Ago-Iwoye). The members of Executive paid a courtesy call to the Chairman which coincided with their maiden meeting held at Simeon Adebo Library, Kuto, Abeokuta. Some burning issues were raised at the meeting for consideration by the Board such as the imposition of non-professionals as heads of libraries in state owned institutions, improving on the services of public libraries as well as school libraries.

### **READING AND QUIZ COMPETITIONS**

Reading and quiz competitions were organised in two different locations viz: Federal College of Education, Abeokuta and Simeon Adebo Library, Kuto, Abeokuta. Contestants were drawn from Primary and Secondary Schools within Abeokuta environ. A text was given to all the contestants to read, from where questions were drawn. After the programme participating schools were given refreshments.

#### **ONLINE WORKSHOP AND SEMINAR**

On Monday 12<sup>th</sup> June 2023 an online seminar was organised where two speakers were engaged. Dr. T.M. Salisu spoke on 'Mentoring' while Dr. B. Atulomah spoke on 'Emerging technology trends'. After this event, another online training was organised focusing on the creation of ebook and publishing held between Friday, 25<sup>th</sup> and Saturday, 26<sup>th</sup> September, 2023. Our choice of using online as the preferred channel of hosting programmes was borne out of the prevailing economic reality and above all the most convenient.



#### 3. Annual Conference In Kontagora:

The pinnacle of our year was the Annual Conference held at the New Lecture Theatre, School of Secondary Education (Science Programs), Federal College of Education Kontagora, themed "Collaborative Approaches in Curbing the Effects of New Media on Fake News Propaganda". The conference, which took place from the 3rd–7th of December 2023, brought together professionals, scholars, and stakeholders in the information industry. Deliberations centred on the collaborative efforts needed to tackle the challenges posed by misinformation, mal information, and disinformation as fake news in the digital age. The event featured insightful keynote addresses by the Chairman of the Committee of Provosts in Nigeria, and the Provost of the FCE Kontagora, Professor Faruk Haruna Rashid. The event was quite insightful with about twenty-five presentations (onsite and virtually) including engaging panel discussions that highlighted collaborative approaches in curbing fake news propaganda.




Image 11 &12: The World Book Day 2024 and cross-section of participants

#### **REPORT ON 2023 ACTIVITIES** OF THE MEDICAL LIBRARY SECTION OF THE NIGERIAN LIBRARY ASSOCIATION

The Medical Library Section has in the past year been actively promoting the crusade of improved health information service delivery among medical librarians in health and medical institutions all across Nigeria. This has been done by generally encouraging full participation of members in Association's activities. This report highlights the key activities of the Medical Library Section for 2023.

Online General meeting: At the beginning of the year, Exco met and felt it was important to have a general meeting with members. This was done to include them in the planning of the year's activities. An online general meeting tagged "Charting a path forward for the Medical Library profession in Nigeria" was held on 29<sup>th</sup> March 2023. The meeting was very well attended by over 45 members from across the country and feedback were very positive as members had the opportunity to offer advice to Exco and propose topics for a webinar that would come up later in the year.

**Online Webinar/workshop:** This event was held via zoom on 5<sup>th</sup> December, 2023. 32 librarians from across the country participated in the webinar. The webinar, had two presentations. One was on literature search skills 3.0 and the other was an introductory lecture on AI vs Librarians for library services. Both presentations provided valuable insights and best practices for librarians who attended. The event received overwhelmingly positive feedback from attendees, who appreciated the opportunity to learn from subject matter experts and interact with colleagues in such virtual setting.

Release of Vol. 6 (1) of Journal of Health Information and Librarianship (JoHIL): The Journal's Editor-in-Chief, Dr. G.A. Ajuwon and her editorial team worked tirelessly to ensure the release of vol. 6 of the Section's journal. The team was able to get JoHIL indexed in Africa Index Medicus (AIMs) and Google scholar. The Association was also able to upgrade and take full possession of the journal's website by redesigning it and making it more interactive so that it is also used to display the associations activities.

International Representation: Eight members of the section participated and presented papers at the Association for Health Information and Libraries in Africa (AHILA)'s 2023 conference which took place in Gaborone, Botswana. In addition, during the AGM, two MLA members, Mr Billiamin O. Popoola and Dr Violet E. Ikolo contested and won executive positions of Secretary General and Assistant Secretary General of AHILA respectively.
